

LineupNX 2 release note 20_009

Special codes and color with the LineupNX teleprompter

The LineupNX teleprompter uses special codes in the copy to set teleprompter colors and to help in the timing of announcer copy.

Here are the codes we use and what they mean.

":"

The colon on a line indicates that the text on that line should not be included in the script timing, that it is information rather than copy. LineupNX also lets you set a specific color for lines with this code as an indicator to the reader that the material is not to be read on camera.

"^"

The caret, [Shift]6 on a line by itself tells LineupNX that what follows is copy that will be read live but there will be pictures rolling and the announcer will be reading a voice-over. LineupNX will use this symbol to calculate the amount of tape needed for the voice over and put that time in the tape runs column of the rundown. It will time the copy that is read before the tape rolls separately and insert that time in the Copy or Intro time column for the item. You can also set a text color for the teleprompter for this voice over material

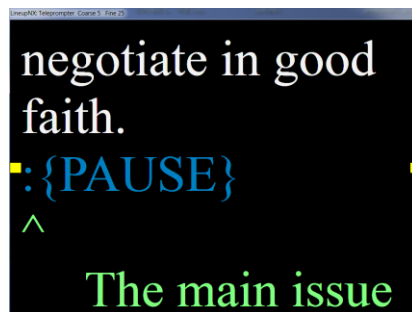

If your show uses two readers, you can set a second reader color in the LineupNX Preferences and Options. You then use the ~1 at the beginning of a line the first anchor reads and ~2 on lines to be read by the second anchor.

Here is what it looks like

First is the copy from the LineupNX intro editor and then what it looks like on the teleprompter.
